Garrett Rogers, Paralegal, reported on the Voluntary Exclusion Program statistics for the month of November 2021.

Executive Director Brownlee reported:

- KRGC staff welcomes Commissioner Spalding and thanks Commissioner Myres for his service to the state.
- Nebraska has approved sports betting and allowed it to be offered at parimutuel racetracks. Kansas and Missouri are now the only states in the region to prohibit sports betting.
- Following the recent severe weather, former commissioner Dennis McKinney sent a letter emphasizing the importance of safe rooms and tornado procedures.
- State offices are scheduled to return to in-person services on January 3rd.
- The next commission meeting is scheduled for January 14th. Chairman Moses said he is unable to attend and requested rescheduling the meeting date to January 21st. All other commissioners agreed to the date change.
- Chairman Moses asked if KRGC is providing any information to assist in drafting sports betting legislation. Executive Director Brownlee stated that KRGC does have opportunities to provide input in the legislative process. Chairman Moses and Commissioner Kultala expressed interest in receiving reports

from the Government Relations Manager, Todd Allen, on sports betting legislation.

Employees

During the second half of 2021, Kansas Star Casino processed 108 new team members through new hire orientation. All received the following training courses as part of orientation:

- Responsible Gaming with special emphasis on underage awareness and an overview of the Voluntary Exclusion Program
- Alcohol Awareness

In addition, team members are subject to a more intensive alcohol awareness training program called, ServSafe. Team members that are trained includes:

- All Front of House Food and Beverage team members that participate in the serving of alcoholic beverages.
- All Security Staff
- All Valet Staff
- Slot Floorperson and above
- Table Games Dealers and above
- Surveillance
- All Directors

ServSafe is a three-hour course with a test at the end which team members must pass with at least a 75% score. In the second half of 2021, 109 team members took the ServSafe training, and 6 team members failed, and 6 team members will be required to re-take until they pass the course.

Kristi Lubash, Beverage Manager, and Amy Perry, Table Games Dual Floor Supervisor, are the Kansas Star Casino certified ServSafe trainers and administers all classes.

The Kansas Star Casino Responsible Gaming trainers are:

- Alecia Pray, Director of Human Resources
- Miranda Fields, Human Resources Manager
- Marlene Rivera, Human Resources Specialist

As of December 31, 2021, Kansas Star Casino had 580 active team members.

Ongoing Training

In addition to the training given in new hire orientation, all Kansas Star Casino team members undergo annual refresher training in Responsible Gaming. To make training more accessible we have the Responsible Gaming training module online in our suite of Skillsoft courses.

The total amount spent on responsible gaming materials was \$2,088.10, which was spent on ServSafe training manuals.

- Responsible Gaming Week was held September 19-25, 2021. Kansas Star Casino team members wore buttons during the week and had a team member Q and A which resulted in the top 5 team members winning prizes.

Daily Application

While all departments and team members are actively involved in preventing underage, intoxicated and self-excluded patrons from entering the casino floor and from gambling if they do gain access, the Security Officers stationed at the gated entrances are the primary method of prevention. Security follows the property's policy of checking IDs for people who appear 30 or younger; the statistics for these ID checks during the second half of 2021 are:

- Underage individuals denied gaming floor access: 236.
- People denied access for not having ID: 1461.
- People denied for invalid ID: 814.
- Intoxicated individuals denied gaming floor access: 290.
- VEPs denied access to the gaming floor: 10.

Further, there were 401 intoxicated individuals ejected from the casino, 18 VEPs were removed and turned over to the KRGC and the Mulvane Police Department; 3 underage persons were caught and ejected from the casino. Also, 350 persons were removed from the casino for a variety of reasons.

During the second half of 2021, there were 1,414,859 guests who entered the casino floor. Security team members checked 192,053 IDs. In addition, 100 ID checks took place on the gaming floor in situations involving suspected minors.

Several other ongoing efforts are noteworthy as the Kansas Star Casino is an active member and participant in the Kansas Coalition on Problem Gambling, Problem Gambling Program Committee, and the South-Central Task Force on Problem Gambling.

During Responsible Month, all team members were issued buttons signifying Responsible Gaming. In addition, Kansas Star Casino held a drawing with the top five team members winning prizes for their participation in Responsible Gaming Month.

1. Employees

At the end of the reporting period, Hollywood Casino has a total of 367 employees. During the reporting period, 145 employees were hired.

2. Responsible Gaming Training:

All employees hired during the reporting period received initial training on responsible gaming during property orientation. This consisted of approximately 30 minutes dedicated to responsible gaming. All employees successfully completed this training.

Of those new hires, 41 were hired into positions which require additional training to understand the proper procedures for responsible alcohol service. All of those employees successfully completed the TiPS training.

In addition, there were 32 existing employees who successfully completed refresher TiPS training.

3. Statistics:

To assist in tracking the success of the Responsible Gaming Plan, Hollywood Casino maintains statistics related to responsible gaming. Some of the numbers from the reporting period include:

- Hollywood Casino refused entry to 42 minors who attempted to gain access to the property.
- There were 3 minors who successfully gained access to the casino during the period.
- In addition, Hollywood Casino either refused entry to or removed from the property 147 individuals who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol.
- In addition to training officers to be observant at the casino entrances, Hollywood Casino has procedures in place to identify VEPs when they attempt to cash a check, perform a cash advance, attempt to claim a taxable jackpot, or attempt to create a mychoice (player club) account. During the reporting period, Hollywood Casino discovered 16 VEPs on property. The local KRGC Agent on Duty was contacted immediately in each of these instances and took custody of the VEP for processing.

AGENDA ITEM: Kansas Greyhound Registry Contract

PRESENTER: Brandi White, Director of Admin, Finance and Audit

ISSUE SUMMARY: Historically, the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission (KRGC) has contracted with the Kansas Greyhound Association (KGA) to operate the Kansas Greyhound Registry (KGR) for the State of Kansas. The KGR is tasked with ensuring that greyhounds registered as Kansas Bred were bred in Kansas and have spent at least the first six months of their lives on Kansas soil. Kansas bred registered greyhounds qualify for extra monies on a monthly basis calculated by the number of points earned by winning certain races and special stake races. For inclusion on the Kansas Greyhound Registry, each female bred must be owned or leased by a Kansas-qualified breeder within 45 days of the breeding date. A Kansas-qualified breeder is an individual who has been a resident of Kansas for a minimum of two years before breeding. The KGA has requested a renewal of the contract for calendar year 2022. The KGA is not requesting any funding for calendar year 2022.

There are several changes proposed to the contract for calendar year 2022. The following contract revisions are recommended:

- 1) Changing the submission of the financial reports from monthly to quarterly.
- 2) Waiving the requirement of a surety bond until racing returns to Kansas at which time the KGA must submit a surety bond in the amount of \$50,000 in a form approved by KRGC.

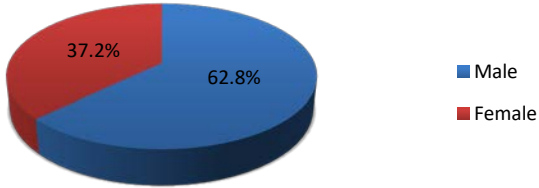

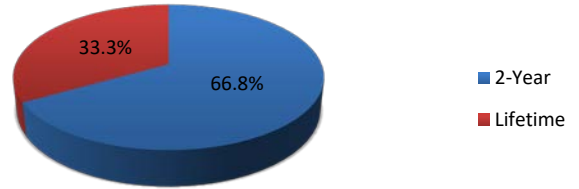
Voluntary Exclusion Program January 2010 –December 2021

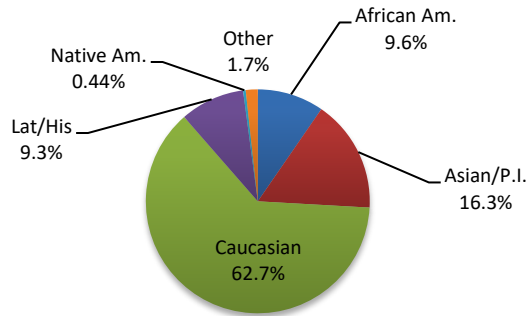
VEP Gender



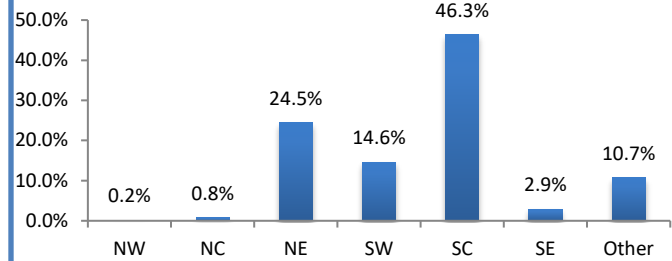
Exclusion Period



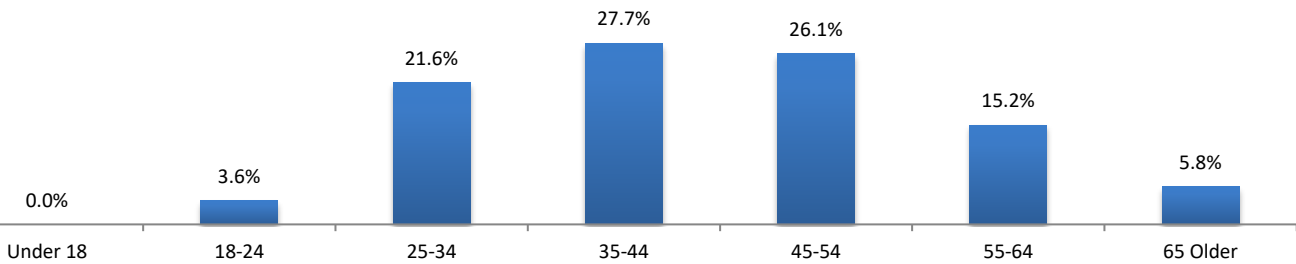
Ethnicity



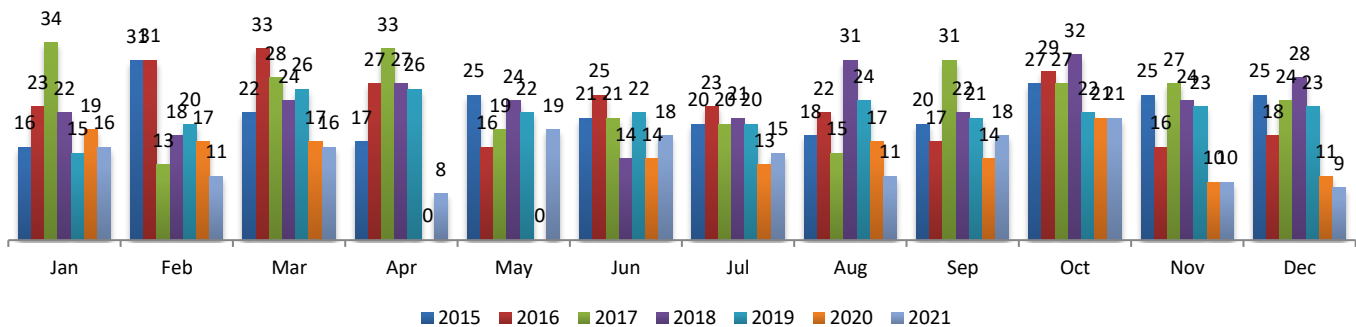
Lottery Region

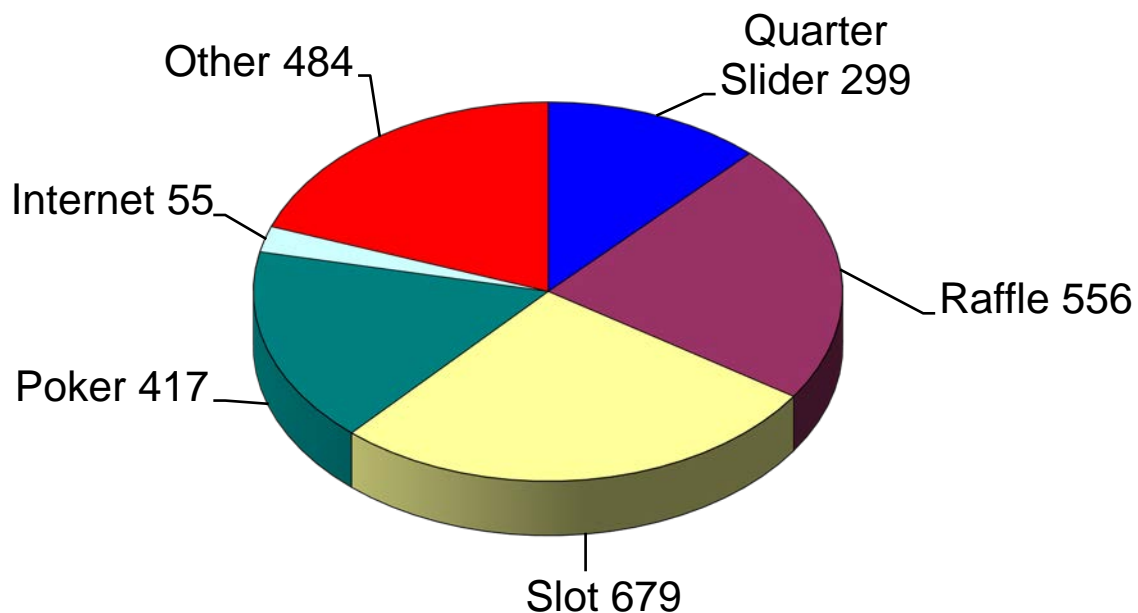
III. ILLEGAL GAMBLING

The Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission (KRGC) provides resources and assistance to local law enforcement, prosecutors, and the public on illegal gambling questions, education, and complaints. The KRGC responds to email and phone complaints and inquiries, conducts continuing legal education seminars for prosecutors, assists local law enforcement agencies with illegal gambling investigations, and conducts civil seizures of illegal gambling devices for forfeiture, all in an effort to curtail illegal gambling in bars, restaurants, convenience stores, and other venues throughout Kansas.

Since 2008, the Commission has received 2,490 total illegal gambling-related questions or complaints from the general public. During the fourth quarter (Q-4) of 2021, the Commission received fifteen (15) calls and emails from the general public, down seven (7) from the previous quarter and down fifteen (15) from the third quarter of 2020.

Of the fifteen (15) calls and emails received in Q-3, four (4) involved slot machines; three (3) involved raffles; four (4) involved poker; and four (4) involved other types of gambling. Of the four (4) other calls received, two (2) involved daily fantasy sports, one (1) involved trivia games, and one (1) regarding advanced deposit wagering accounts.

Breakdown of illegal gambling inquiries and complaints to-date:

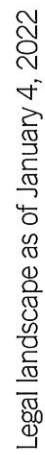


The above chart does not reflect calls and activity related to the following:

- Reports made to KRGc agents by other law enforcement officers around the state.
- Discussions with local law enforcement and district and county attorneys regarding the legal aspects of illegal gambling and the services that KRGc can provide.
- Time spent by agents and legal counsel to assist in active local investigations and prosecutions.
- Time spent defending gambling-related actions against the agency.
- Time spent pursuing seizures and forfeitures of illegal gambling devices.
- Inquiries from the public that are answered through access to KRGc's Illegal Gambling Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) web page.
- In December, within a span of three days, agents served 9 search warrants on a total of 120 illegal gambling machines that were seized by the Wichita Police Department.

KRGc updated the Illegal Gambling FAQs portion of the webpage in late January 2014. Since KRGc began tracking the new page, there have been a total of 20,001 unique page views (after adjustments). A total of 318 unique page views were made during the fourth quarter of 2021, down 67 from the previous quarter (adjusted) and down 185 from the fourth quarter of 2020 (adjusted). 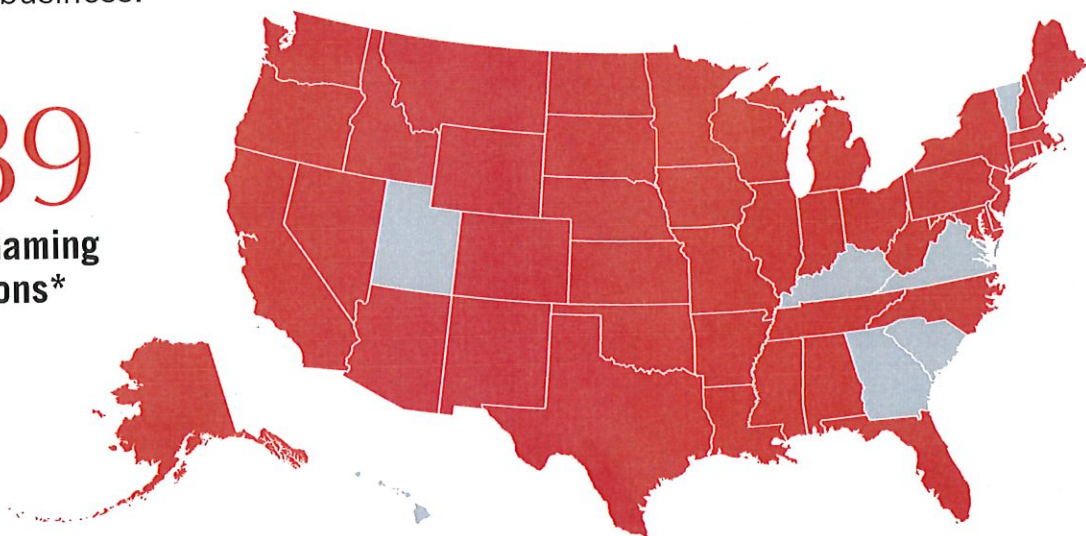

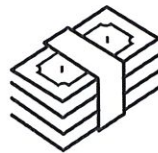

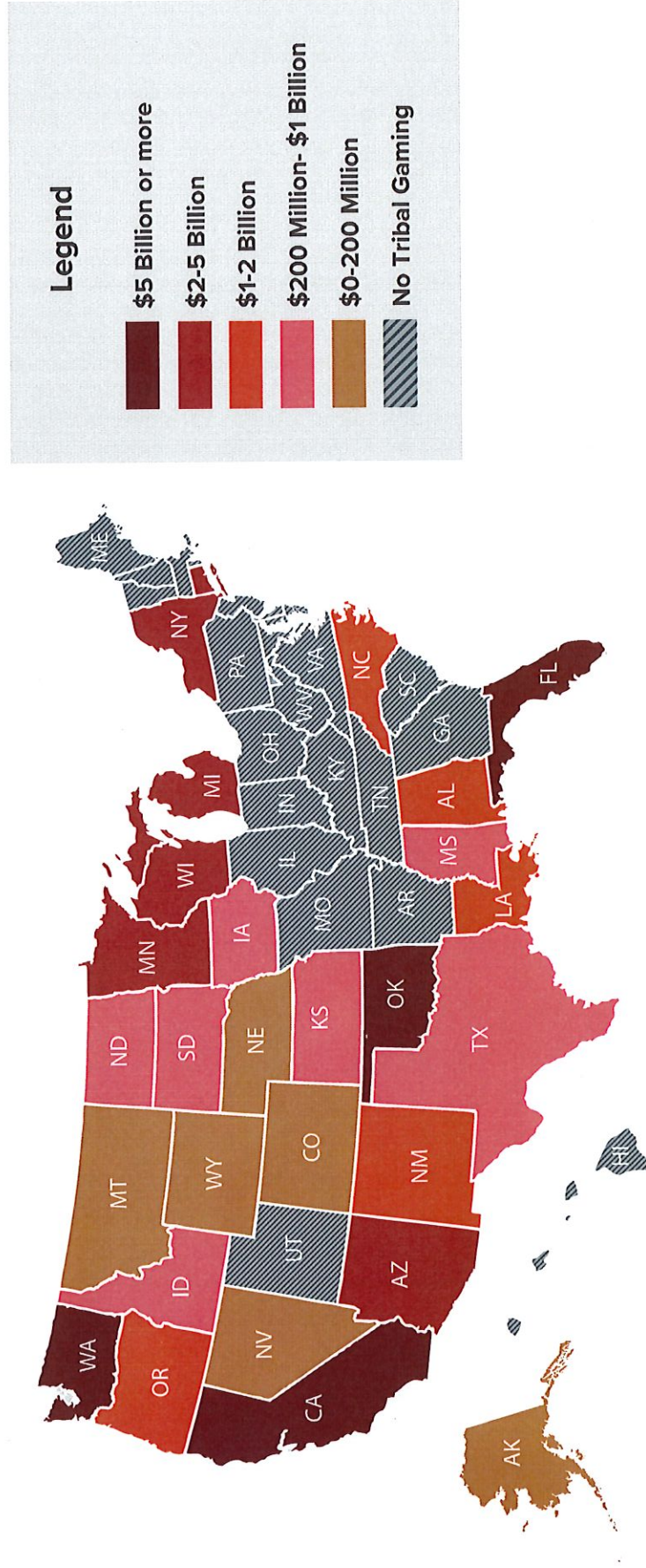
