Garrett Rogers, Paralegal, reported on the Voluntary Exclusion Program statistics for the month of February 2021.

Todd Allen, Government Relations Manager, legislative report:

- KRGC budget has been heard in both houses, and both committees concurred with the Governor's recommendation.
- SB404 had a hearing February 16<sup>th</sup>. During the hearing, there was a debate about the provision of the bill allowing Sedgwick County a revote to allow for the operation of electronic gaming machines at a racetrack gaming facility, and also authorizing the operation of historical horse race machines by parimutuel licensees.
- A sports wagering bill was introduced to the House Federal and State Affairs committee on March 9<sup>th</sup>.

Executive Director Brownlee reported:

- Arkansas expanded their sports wagering law to allow online sports wagering. Their West Memphis casino was the first to offer this to the public.
- Peninsula Pacific will sell its assets to Churchill Downs. This will not affect the Kansas Crossing Casino as theirs is a management contract and not property assets. The assets being purchased include a horse racing track in Virginia, six historical horse racing venues in Virginia, a casino in New York, a casino in Iowa, and the rights to develop two casinos and seven additional horse racing venues in Virginia.

- The mask mandate for state buildings has been removed. This allows us to return to in-person commission meetings if the commissioners wish to. Chairman Moses asked if any commissioners were opposed to meeting in-person. No commissioners objected.
- The next Commission Meeting will be on April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022.



January 2010 – March 2022














### III. ILLEGAL GAMBLING

The Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission (KRGC) provides resources and assistance to local law enforcement, prosecutors, and the public on illegal gambling questions, education, and complaints. The KRGC responds to email and phone complaints and inquiries, conducts continuing legal education seminars for prosecutors, assists local law enforcement agencies with illegal gambling investigations, and conducts civil seizures of illegal gambling devices for forfeiture, all in an effort to curtail illegal gambling in bars, restaurants, convenience stores, and other venues throughout Kansas.

Since 2007, the Commission has received 2,512 total illegal gambling-related questions or complaints from the general public. During the first quarter (Q-1) of 2022, the Commission received twenty-two (22) calls and emails from the general public, up one (1) from the previous quarter and down five (5) from the first quarter of 2021.

Of the twenty-two (22) calls and emails received in Q-1, three (3) involved quarter slider machines; two (2) involved a raffle; six (6) involved slot machines; four (4) involved poker; and seven (7) involved other types of gambling. Of the seven (7) other calls or emails received, one (1) involved March Madness brackets; one (1) involved establishing a casino; and four (5) involved parimutuel racing.

#### **Breakdown of illegal gambling inquiries and complaints to-date:**



The above chart does not reflect calls and activity related to the following:

- Reports made to KRGC agents by other law enforcement officers around the state.
- Discussions with local law enforcement and district and county attorneys regarding the legal aspects of illegal gambling and the services that KRGC can provide.
- Time spent by agents and legal counsel to assist in active local investigations and prosecutions.
- Time spent defending gambling-related actions against the agency.
- Time spent pursuing seizures and forfeitures of illegal gambling devices.
- Inquiries from the public that are answered through access to KRGC's Illegal Gambling Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) web page.

KRGC updated the Illegal Gambling FAQs portion of the webpage in late January 2014. Since KRGC began tracking the new page, there have been a total of 20,518 unique page views (after adjustments). A total of 517 unique page views were made during the first quarter of 2022, up 199 from the previous quarter (adjusted) and down 147 from the first quarter of 2021 (adjusted).
