MINUTES – JANUARY 17, 2025

CALL TO ORDER (A.)

Chairman David Moses called the January 17, 2025, meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. The meeting was held at the Eisenhower State Office Building in Topeka, Kansas. Notice of this meeting was given to the public via the KRGC and Public Square websites and the agency's social media pages. Commissioners Brandon Jones, Larry Turnquist, and Mike Fleming were also present. Others present included Executive Director Don Brownlee, General Counsel Judith Taylor, Director of IT&C-s Dennis Bachman, Director of Security, Licensing, and Backgrounds Roger Bailey, Director of Gambling DJ Lopez, Director of Casino Operations Rick Wilson, Government Relations Manager Randy Evans, and other staff.

MOTION, APPROVE AGENDA (B.)

Executive Director Brownlee explained that staff did have an amendment to the agenda, the removal of an item from the Other Business section.

Commissioner Jones (Fleming) moved to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried 4-0.

MOTION, APPROVE DECEMBER 13, 2024 MEETING MINUTES (C.)

Commissioner Fleming (Jones) moved to approve the minutes of the December 13, 2024 meeting. Motion carried 3-0.

Commissioner Turnquist abstained from voting as he was not present at the December 2024 meeting.

MOTION, APPROVE CONSENT AGENDA (D.)

Commissioner Turnquist (Jones) moved to approve the consent agenda (six items). Motion carried 4-0.

Ryan Deutsch, General Manager, reported:

- December 2024 revenue numbers compared to December 2023:

 - Total slot revenue was down 7.85%
 - Table games revenue was up 10.62%

 - Down 68.10% from December 2023.

- Chairman Moses asked what caused the disparity between the state's share of revenue between December of 2023 and December of 2024. Director of Administration, Audit, and Finance Brandi White explained that December 1st – 15th of 2024 the state received 22% and from December 16th – 31st the state received 24%, and that due to the rate change, the figures appear separately. Chairman Moses remarked that Commissioner Jones pointed out when the two figures for December 2024 were combined and then compared to December of 2023 the difference is within what is to be expected. Director White noted that there will be two figures appearing in the revenue reports going forward for a while. Executive Director Brownlee commented that there would be discussion in executive session on this topic.
- Semi-Annual Responsible Gambling Report
 - 239 active employees as of December 31, 2024
 - 59 were hired during the reporting period.
 - 25 existing employees have recertified their TIPS testing for another 3-year period.
 - 220 active employees completed annual refresher training for TIPS/Responsible Alcohol Service during the 4th Quarter of 2024.
 - BHCMC, LLC has 2 certified TIPS Trainers on property.

- 57 new hires have taken Responsible Gaming during the reporting period
- 220 active employees completed annual refresher training for Responsible Gaming during the 4th Quarter of 2024
- BHCR participated in Responsible Gaming Education Month in September 2023
- 0 VEPs were refused entry to the casino floor
- 3 VEPs were removed from the casino floor
- 101 individuals were refused entry because they appeared intoxicated
- 45 individuals were removed because they appeared intoxicated
- 104 minors were refused entry to the casino floor
- 0 minor was removed from the casino floor
- 413 individuals were denied entry for not having an ID
- 382 individuals were denied entry for having an invalid ID
- Chairman Moses noted that there has been a lot of education about updating your state ID to a Real ID and asked if the facility manager requires patrons to have a Real ID, the license with the star. General Manager Deutsch answered stating that the facility requires that patrons have a valid ID. Chairman Moses asked once the Real ID becomes a requirement will the software be able to reflect this update. General Manager Deutsch confirmed that their software would be updated to comply with any changes.

Alli Kuplen, General Manager, reported:

- December 2024 revenue numbers compared to December 2023:
 - Total gross gaming revenue was down 3.7%
 - Total slot revenue down 2.1%
 - Table games revenue down 2.8%
- December 2024 Sports Wagering revenue
 - Retail Sportsbook Revenue \$108,000.00.
 - Down from December 2023's revenue of \$325,000.00.
 - Digital Sportsbook Revenue: \$3,900,000.00
 - Down from December 2023's revenue of \$8,200,000.00.
- December 2024 Sports Wagering
 - \$79 million was wagered on FanDuel online.
 - The total handle in retail was \$1.21 million for December.
 - Football once again ruled the betting in retail as the NFL had 54% of the total handle followed by college football with 29%. They were followed by College Basketball at 12%, NBA at 3% NHL at 1% and MMA at 1%.
 - The largest bet of the month was \$12,500 futures bet on the Baltimore Ravens to win the Super Bowl. This wager will pay out \$100,000 but will not be settled until after the Super Bowl.
- Commissioner Fleming asked if there was any explanation for why the digital sportsbook revenue is down. General Manager Kuplen explained that the sportsbook held about 5.1% compared to last year's 9.72%.

- Semi-Annual Responsible Gambling Report
 - During the second half of 2024, Kansas Star Casino processed 143 new team members through new hire orientation, Responsible Gaming, and Alcohol Awareness trainings.
 - All Front of House Food and Beverage managers and team members that participate in the serving of alcoholic beverages, all Security Staff, all Valet Staff, Slot Floor persons and above, Table Games Dealers and above, Surveillance Staff, and all Directors are subject to a more intensive alcohol awareness training program called, ServSafe.
 - In the second half of 2024, 135 team members took the ServSafe training, and 0 team members failed.
 - The Kansas Star Casino has 3 Responsible Gaming Trainers on property.
 - As of December 31, 2024, Kansas Star Casino had 620 active team members.
 - Underage individuals denied gaming floor access: 184
 - People denied access for not having ID: 489
 - People denied for invalid ID: 330
 - Intoxicated individuals denied gaming floor access: 127
 - VEPs denied access to the gaming floor: 10
 - There were 260 intoxicated individuals ejected from the casino.
 - 11 VEPs were removed and turned over to the KRGC and the Mulvane Police Department.
 - 1 underage person was caught and ejected from the casino
 - 135 persons were removed and 23 excluded from the casino for a variety of other reasons.
 - During the second half of 2024, there were 609,391 guests who entered the casino floor. Security team members checked 91,492 IDs. In addition, 106 ID checks took place on the gaming floor in situations involving suspected minors.
 - Several other ongoing efforts are noteworthy as the Kansas Star Casino is an active member and participant in the Kansas Coalition

on Problem Gambling, Problem Gambling Program Committee, and the South-Central Task Force on Problem Gambling.

- General Manager Kuplen announced that Kansas Star has a new Assistant General Manager Paul Stegner.

Lydia Garvey, General Manager, reported:

- December 2024 admissions were down 3.3% compared to December 2023

 - Table games revenue decreased 8.9%
- December 2024 Sports Wagering revenue numbers

 - Hold was -4%. This was driven by the NFL which had a hold of -11.28% and College Football which had a hold of 1.5%.
 - Retail Sportsbook: Top Sports

 - College Basketball was 12% of handle
 - Digital Sportsbook Taxable Revenue: -\$184,656.00
 - Hold was negative. NFL had -6.6% and very low hold on College Football.

 - NFL was 41% of handle
 - College Football was 19% of handle
 - NBA was 14% of handle

- General Manager Garvey announced that an agreement had been reached with the Unified Government for an amendment to the development agreement and the facility is in the very early stages of pursuing the construction of a hotel adjacent to the casino. Chairman Moses congratulated General Manager Garvey and commented that he presumed there was not a target date for opening. General Manager Garvey confirmed that there was not a target opening date at this time,

but that she expects things will really firm up in the next 90-days and she will have more information.

- Commissioner Fleming asked if there was any expectation for the number of beds. General Manager Garvey responded that it was too early to tell.
- Commissioner Fleming asked if General Manager Garvey has heard any rumors about the Chiefs relocation. General Manager Garvey stated that the rumor she heard was that the Hunts would prefer to stay in Missouri and renovate the area and stadium.
- Semi-Annual Responsible Gambling Report
 - At the end of the reporting period, Hollywood Casino has a total of 472 employees. During the reporting period, 151 employees were hired.
 - All employees hired during the reporting period received initial training on responsible
 - gaming during property orientation.
 - Of those new hires, 39 were hired into positions which require additional training to understand the proper procedures for responsible alcohol service. All of those employees successfully completed the TiPS training. In addition, there were 13 existing employees who successfully completed refresher TiPS training and 7 employees that transferred into new positions that required them to be TiPS certified.
 - 72 minors were refused entry to the casino
 - 3 minor gained access to the casino
 - 170 individuals were refused entry because of appearing intoxicated
 - 13 VEPs gained access to the casino
 - PENN Entertainment and Hollywood Casino participated in Responsible Gaming Education Month in September.
 - PENN Entertainment developed a promotion for the general public where they had the opportunity to review some responsible gaming content, take a brief quiz on that content, and be entered into a drawing for a chance to win a cruise for two on Norwegian Cruise Lines.
 - Hollywood Casino posted responsible gaming related signage throughout the casino and back of house areas. In addition, we held drawings and awarded prizes to our team members who completed responsible gaming related quizzes and word searches throughout the month.

Jeff McKain, General Manager, reported:

 - Digital wagers were up 32% coming in at \$49,565,269.00
 - Chairman Moses asked if the reported figures were correct in that there was a \$3.2 million drop in revenue from year-to-year. General Manager McKain confirmed the figures were correct and noted that the total amount wagered year-to-year was up. Chairman Moses asked if there was an explanation for the drop in revenue. General Manager McKain responded that the patrons had placed very good bets. Chairman Moses asked which sportsbooks the facility is partnered with. General Manager McKain stated BetFanatics, BetMGM, and Caesars. Chairman Moses asked if all three sportsbooks experienced a severe drop. General Manager McKain explained that one sportsbook was significantly worse than the other two. Chairman Moses asked if this is a one-off or if this could be routine. General Manager McKain responded that this was pretty significant and that he believes it will not occur frequently.

 - College Football was 25% of handle
 - College Basketball was 12% of handle.
- Largest winning wager \$17,000 on Bengals vs. Cowboys.
- Largest losing wager was a \$20,000 money line wager, on the Pittsburgh Steelers.

STAFF REPORTS
(I.1. and I.2.)

Garrett Rogers, Paralegal, reported on both the Voluntary Exclusion Program and Sports Wagering Exclusion Program statistics for the months of December 2024 and the 2024 fourth-quarter illegal gambling report.

Government Relations Manager Randy Evans reported:

- The Legislature opened session on Monday of this week.
- Very few bills have been introduced and no bills have been introduced that will would be concern for KRGc.
- On Wednesday of next week there is a budget hearing that Director of Administration, Audit, and Finance Brandi White will be attending.
- Chairman Moses recalled that there was a pre-filed or carried over bill regarding smokeless casinos. Mr. Evans responded that the bill had not yet received a hearing or been worked. Chairman Moses noted that Mr. Evans likely then has not been able to review it to see if it is different than the previous legislation. Mr. Evans confirmed that was accurate.

Executive Director Brownlee reported:

- KRGc staff congratulate Ryan Deutsch in his selection as General Manager and welcome Paul Stegner back to Kansas.
- KRGc has hired a new IT support employee, Triston Burr.
- KRGc is in the process of updating IT equipment in field offices this year.
- The legislature has altered their methods of budget review, the legislators are receiving budgets prior to session, and meet with agency staff prior to session, all to get a jump start on approving budgets once the session has begun. There are still a lot of unknowns of how that process will interact with the Governor's budget recommendations.
- Additionally, KRGc received notice that the Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee has requested agencies provide a proposal that would reduce each agencies State General Fund budget request by 7.5%. KRGc does not use any general fund monies, so one would think that this would not involve this agency. However, frequently in the past KRGc has been held to same budget standards even though the agency does not use general fund money.
- Governor Kelly is recommending a 2.5% pay raise for state government employees.
- Missouri passed legislation recently to offer sports wagering. Their legislation required that they have it operating by December 1st, 2025. The Missouri Gaming Commission has reported that they intend to have sports wagering operating this summer.
- The next commission meeting is scheduled for February 14, 2025 in Topeka at 10:00am.

- Chairman Moses noted that one of the commissioners has a conflict for the March 14th meeting date. Chairman Moses suggested that since there will still be a quorum with a commissioner missing, that the meeting remain as scheduled. Chairman Moses asked if the Executive Director had any thoughts on this. Executive Director Brownlee noted that it easier for staff for the meeting to remain as scheduled, but if a change is requested staff can accommodate. The commissioners agreed to leave the meeting as scheduled.





Total Number of Exclusions






Active Sports Wagering Exclusion Durations



SWE Enrollment by Platform*




SPORTS WAGERING EXCLUSION ENROLLMENT BY MONTH






VEP Gender








